#### **Personal Financial Integrity Defined**

Righteous congruence and connection between what we know, who we are, and what we do.

James 4:17 "For to him who knows to do good and doesn't do it, it is a sin."

- Personal Financial Integrity is defined as a congruence between what we know and believe that scripture says about money and our stewardship of it, and the faithful practice of that knowledge in our everyday lives.
- "Putting your money where your mouth is."





#### Personal Financial Integrity for the Minister is a Spiritual Issue and a **Management Issue:**

- Personal Financial Integrity is both a and a issue, and one does not negate the other.
- For the Christ-follower, money is a tool to be used within the context of the Kingdom in an effort to accomplish Kingdom-purposes.

#### A Theology of Money:

- 1 Timothy 6:10 "For the love of money is the root of all sorts of evil."
- We all have 3 basic needs that serve as the motivating drives in our lives.
- A carnal view of money creates the illusion that all three of these needs can be met through the acquisition of money and what it can buy for us.
- Any minister who has had a problem and has made improper decisions with Church money started with an improper view of money and its power to satisfy their needs of Security, Significance, and Self-worth.
- Money is a resource that must be managed, or it will manage you.
- \_\_\_\_\_ is a must for every believer but is even more essential for the minister who wants to maintain their credibility to lead.

#### FOUR CHARACTERISTICS OF A SERVANT

#### 1. Servants have personally experienced

(Matthew 14:15–21) As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." "We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered. "Bring them here to me," he said. And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. 

	Proposition – The whole sermon in a simple sentence.
	Transition – The key transitional word connects the introduction to the main points of the sermon.
	Main Points – The Main Points should connect directly to the transitional statement.
