This edition of *The Virginian* is centered around the theme of **Refreshing**. The articles that comprise this issue speak about refreshing that results from repentance, preaching and restoration. Psalm 19:7 reminds us that the Lord's perfect law refreshes the soul. I hope that you will be refreshed in your mind and your spirit as you peruse this edition.

Recently, Herman Jay Fields, a retired pastor, went to be with the Lord. He left some notes in his Bible from the last sermon that he preached entitled "Not for Sale." This sermon was a source of refreshing for me, and I trust that you will find it to be one for you as well.

King Ahab, King of Israel, a unique personality, not righteous by any means, is doing all he can to thwart the work of Elijah, the prophet of God. This is amplified by the happenings in 1 Kings 18, fire on the altar and secondly, rain after 3 1/2 years of drought. 1 Kings 19 expresses how the wife of Ahab, Jezebel, conspires to kill Elijah. This is a troublesome picture.

Ahab's capital was located in Samaria, on the road toward Jerusalem. However, he had another resort built in Jezreel. As he was touring this area, he noticed a vineyard. This was the perfect place for a vineyard of this scale. He wanted this with all that was in him. "He desired to have it." His warped thinking was something like this: I have palaces, soldiers, storehouses, treasures of gold and silver, servants, horses, and chariots. This, however, was not enough! He was determined to possess this small vineyard. The more he had, the more he wanted.

Ahab travels back to his palace, sent the message to Naboth, the owner of this magnificent vineyard, "I want your vineyard." The devil and the world always want whatever it is that you have accomplished for the Kingdom of God. Ahab had a host of reasons for his selfish motives.

The powers of hell always want that which belongs to you!

There were two reasons why Naboth, the owner of this vineyard, did not want to sell to the King. 1.) I can not sell to you what my fathers have given to me as an inheritance. Many generations have passed to make sure that I have this vineyard. 2.) Law of Moses forbade Naboth from selling his inheritance, and in the year of Jubilee, it reverts to the original owner. Naboth was a God-fearing man!

This is not what King Ahab wants to hear or receive. Ahab is one unhappy man. His displeasure is immeasurable. Ahab is out of sorts and desires Jezebel to help him out. Don't be surprised when the world does anything to get what they want. Politically, emotionally, spiritually, you get the message. We must make a gentle, but firm stand by saying and demonstrating that neither we nor our ministry are for sale.

This story of actual historic consequence is this: Jezebel committed to having Naboth killed so that Ahab may take possession of the vineyard. All of this is so that Ahab can have his way. Conceit and arrogance can destroy relationships, church work, and benevolence ministry to a hurting world. You and I are not for sale, and neither is the work that we have committed unto the King of Kings.

This entire message speaks to us to be firm in our commitment to the Lord Jesus. Paul wrote, "Therefore, since we have these promises, dear friends, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out of reverence for God. Make room for us in your hearts. We have wronged no one, we have corrupted no one, we have exploited no one. I do not say this to condemn you; I have said before that you have such a place in our hearts that we would live or die with you. I have spoken to you with great frankness; I take great pride in you. I am greatly encouraged; in all our troubles my joy knows no bounds" (2 Corinthians 7:1-4).

Here is this issue in its anointing and power for a living reality for us! May God grant you the fortitude to keep moving forward as Jesus Christ gives us the light to march.

When I played high school football, players would often pair up during strength and conditioning. One particular drill we used was the harness run. In this drill, one player would wear a harness while the other player would hold you back while you were running. One day I was paired with a teammate who was as wide as he was tall. He outweighed me by at least one hundred fifty pounds. Very few players could barely move this player. On that fateful day, I made NO forward progress. I was running in place, and he was laughing at me and my lack of movement. Isn't that the way sin works in a person's life? It holds them down and keeps them from making any forward progress. That is why we are encouraged to "lay aside" sin in Hebrews 12:1.

In his second sermon found in Acts 3, Peter lays out clear guidelines for salvation and refreshing, which is repentance! Acts 3:19, "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." It is this same model and message that John the Baptist used to prepare the way for our Lord, Matthew 3:1-2. After His baptism and wilderness temptation, Jesus opened His public ministry in the same manner as John, "...Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Matthew 4:17). In each case, spiritual life or spiritual refreshing started with repentance.

A simple definition of repentance is a change in direction. Another way to think of repentance is like making a U-turn. It is the moment when a person realizes that their life is headed in the wrong direction. This moment is directed by the Holy Spirit, as an individual is convicted of and corrected regarding the error of their ways. As a person repents, there is a burden that is lifted. A burden or weight that is often unknown to the individual but is realized at the moment of repentance. With the removal of this burden comes a flood of grace, love, peace,

and joy. That is what refreshing feels like, waves of God's goodness washing over and over the renewed repentant person.

David understood the burden of sin and the need for refreshing in his Psalm of Repentance, Psalm 51. As David begins his repentance of adultery and murder, we can see the burden of his disobedience and sin as he acknowledges his sin and asks to be washed, cleansed, and purged. As he continues this plea before the Lord, he asks for a clean heart, a renewed spirit, and the restoration of God's joy in his life. As we examine Psalm 51, just like in Acts 3, refreshing and renewal are linked to repentance.

God longs to bring humanity into His abundant life and spiritual refreshing. The key is repentance!

I traveled with a small group of pastors to a pastor's conference in the late nineties. It was the early days of cell phones and our GPS was MapQuest. We made so many U-turns on that trip that it was comical, but with each U-turn, it meant we were getting back on the right path. That's what repentance is, getting on the right path, the path that leads to forgiveness, grace, peace, joy, and refreshing.

If you are lost and do not have a relationship with God, repentance is your pathway to refreshing. If you are struggling with sin, refreshing will come through repentance. If your walk with God is marked by disobedience and failure, repentance can bring your needed revival.

Remember the words of Peter: "Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord," Acts 3:19.

### PRODUCTIVE PREACHING!

The following is Webster's definition of the word preach: to exhort in an officious or tiresome manner.

Preaching is quite possibly one of the most powerful and productive tools that a minister can use to move people into a deeper, more fulfilling relationship with Christ. Several years ago, the Lord revealed something to me that I will never forget. I had just finished preaching what I thought was, at best, a very average sermon. It was one of those services that felt like it was going nowhere fast. I made the altar call and people began to come forward.

After a few moments of prayer, all of a sudden, the presence of God began to move powerfully among us. It was during that time, I heard the Lord speak the following to my heart; "When you magnify my Word, I will always manifest my presence." It was so simple yet so significant at the same time. I had just spent the last 45 minutes proclaiming the truth of God's Word, and as a result, the God of the Word showed up and ministered to and refreshed us with His presence in such awe-inspiring way.

Productive preaching will usher in the presence of God, and people will leave refreshed, renewed, and revived.

In Psalm 16:11, David declared, "In your presence is fullness of joy; At your right hand are pleasures forevermore." Acts 10 tells the story of Peter, as a result of Cornelius's fasting and prayer, being summoned to and showing up at his house in Caesarea. Acts 10:34 records the following, "Then Peter opened his mouth and said..." From verses 34 - 44, Peter preaches Jesus to Cornelius and those present at his house. Verse 44 reveals what happens when God's Word is magnified. While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the Word. Not only did the Holy Spirit fall upon them, but He filled them in such a way that those present heard them speaking in tongues. This miraculous moment ends with those who had just received the Holy Spirit being baptized in water. It all started with the preaching of the Word! When we magnify God's Word, He will always, without fail, manifest His presence.

We see a similar scene with Peter again in Acts 2. After the Holy Spirit had filled the 120 who were present in the upper room, Peter being one of them, came out boldly preaching and proclaiming Jesus, His Word, and His works. As a result, 3,000 people were saved, baptized in water, and added to the church. Once again, Peter's preaching created an atmosphere that was conducive to the presence of God being manifested in such a way that people were not only refreshed, but they were transformed.

The early church was indeed birthed in the fire of Pentecost, but it was also birthed in the power of the proclamation of God's Word. I'm convinced that if it worked back then, it can still work today.

Preacher, we have a responsibility. Actually, it's more of a mandate to preach in such a way that people will encounter the life-changing presence of God. Style doesn't matter, but substance does. Paul admonished his young protégé, Timothy, to: Preach the Word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching.

I'm afraid there have been times that we have underestimated the power of preaching and what it's capable of doing.

Productive preaching will:

- Create an atmosphere for the presence of God that will refresh and re-energize people.
- Communicate truth in such a way that people will long to encounter Christ.
- Challenge men and women to pursue God and His will for their lives.
- Change the hearts of those who hear it.
- Catapult the church into a season of revival and renewal.

C.S. Lewis wrote, "Pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pain: it is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world." It is pain that brings us to our knees. It is pain that causes us to draw deeper from the well of God's Word. It is pain that draws us closer to our Savior.

God uses pain and suffering to transform our hearts and lives. He uses it to mold and shape us into His likeness. God puts us on the Potter's Wheel of pain for the purpose of His glory. God promises that "times of refreshing" will come from Him, and we can experience refreshing during the dark seasons of life. Psalm 30:5 tells us that "weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning." Our pain and suffering are not eternal, but our God is, and He is with us from beginning to end, providing seasons of encouragement and refreshing.

#### **Refreshing Through God's Presence**

Life's hardships can be a gateway into the presence of God. King David experienced refreshing after Ziglag and the death of his son. Job experienced refreshing and restoration after his tragedy. Hardships compel us to seek God more, and the more we seek Him, the more we find Him. In His presence, we find everything that we long for. We find comfort, and we experience joy.

Psalm 16:11 speaks of this profound truth. God truly fills us with joy when we are in His presence, and the joy of the Lord brings refreshing. When we take the focus off of us and our problems and fix our eyes on Jesus, we experience the beauty of His presence. God meets us in the middle of our mess, and He desires to bring not only transformation but refreshing during our trials. Difficult seasons of life begin as a prickly caterpillar, but the end result is a beautiful butterfly. We can soar effortlessly like a butterfly through the refreshing that comes in God's presence.

#### **Refreshing Through God's Promises**

God's Word is full of promises, and God has spoken promises to each of us. It's in the difficult seasons of life that we must hold on to God. It's during these times that we can hear His voice, and be reminded of His promises. We should cling to Jeremiah 29:11 when life is hard and disappointments come. As we proclaim God's promises, our hearts and lives are refreshed. Restoration comes. New life begins. God is always working behind the scenes, and He will use pain and hardship to fulfill His plans for our lives (Romans 8:28). The promises of God point us in the direction of our Kingdom destiny.

Often the road to restoration is long, and it is hard, but God is faithful to provide times of refreshing as we take the journey with Him. May the Lord refresh you and restore all that has been seemingly lost.
